



## New Year's Greetings from the Morrison Police Department

This past holiday, I had the occasion to be in the Chicago land area where I'm originally from. Arriving there, I happened to be standing next to a female Chicago Police Officer at the airport while waiting for my luggage. Without prompting she candidly stated to me "am I glad to be down here", (meaning the airport). I related that I was a Sergeant for a small town in Colorado. She looked at me in disbelief and stated, "you look good, you don't want that here, this job will age you". After a brief conversation and the arrival of my luggage I

departed stating, "Please be safe".

My mother currently resides about 20 minutes south from our old neighborhood, the East Side (South Chicago), in Munster, Indiana. While there, I eagerly consumed the Chicago Tribune and a Northwest Indiana newspaper, The Times, with my morning coffee.

I was taken back by the sheer volume of crime and violence reported by the papers in the neighborhoods and suburbs that encompass greater Chicago and the areas around Gary, Indiana. Murder, car jacking's, drug arrests, shootings, robbery's, home invasions, corruption, with criminal proceedings and trials for all of the above that seem to be the daily norm.

Returning home, I have taken notice of how fortunate I am to now live in Colorado and work in Morrison. While we have had some minor criminal concerns here throughout the last year, it certainly wouldn't be noted by the Chicago press. Even though crime has no boundaries, we are somewhat removed and insulated from the violence that precipitates in cities like Chicago, Detroit and LA, here in the "West". It's refreshing to know that places like Morrison still exist with our small town busy main street and where neighbors know each other.

Despite our tranquil environment we still encourage all to be aware of the wolf that lingers out there. Lock your home and car doors, leave a light on a timer, pick up you newspapers from the driveway, remove important items from your vehicles, when shopping place packages in the trunk out of site, and file a Vacation Notice with the Police Department when leaving on vacation. Community Policing defined, is a working partnership with the public being additional eyes for us, assisting by reporting anything suspicious or out of place so we can check on it. These simple actions help to further prevent crime from happening here.



## **UTILITY DEPARTMENT**

The Utility Department has been noticing a substantial increase in the FOG we receive down at the Waste Water Treatment Plant. We would like to give you some tips make sure your taking the proper steps to dispose of your FOGS. Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) come from meats, butters, lard, food scraps, sauces, salad dressings, dairy products, and cooking oil. When FOG goes down the drain, it hardens and causes sewer pipes to clog. This can lead to a Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) where raw sewage actually backs up into your home, lawn, neighborhood, and streets. Not only does this nasty mess cause health issues, it also can run into a nearby stream or river which affects our drinking water. If your pipes

become clogged from putting FOG down the drain, it can be very expensive problem to fix. To avoid household, environmental damage, as well as a costly bill, NEVER put FOG down the drain!

When you have finished cooking, collect liquid grease and oils in a sealable container that you can take to your local drop off location to be recycled. Many of these locations will provide you with a new container you can use. For the grease that cannot be poured into the container, you should wipe pans clean with a paper towel and put it in the trash. Food scraps should also go in the trash. Scrape off excess food from pots, pans, and plates before rinsing them in the sink with cold water.

### **DO and DON'T**

**Do** put oil and grease in covered collection containers.

**Do** scrape food scraps from dishes into trash cans and garbage bags and dispose of properly. Avoid using the garbage disposal.

**Do** remove oil and grease from dishes, pans, fryers, and griddles. Cool first before you skim, scrape, or wipe off excess grease.

**Don't** pour oil and grease down the drain.

**Don't** put food scraps down the drain.

**Don't** rinse off oil and grease with hot water.

### **Water Treatment Plant MCC Replacement.**

The Utility Department will be replacing an extremely old master control center located at the water plant. The electrical that runs the MCC is extremely old, dangerous and outdated being the main reason for the replacement. This should be completed by summer.


